Initiative to advance women in aquaculture and transform Caribbean into 'blue foods powerhouse'

BioMar, a global leader in sustainable aquaculture feeds, has announced the support of Women in Caribbean Aquaculture (WiCA) and the extended organization of the Caribbean Aquaculture Network (CAN). Both organizations were recently formed to support collaboration in the region and ensure the responsible expansion of aquaculture and blue food.

The Caribbean aquaculture industry, although relatively underdeveloped, is ideally situated next to North America, which represents one of the biggest seafood markets in the world. The tropical waters of the region can support a large variety of blue foods; however, to grow in the region, knowledge and infrastructure are required.

Advanced education, especially for women, is a challenge in the Caribbean region and many women seeking to become marine scientists leave for education opportunities in North America and Europe. Many of these women are now scattered around the world but still hold a desire to bring their knowledge home to help make this area into a "blue foods powerhouse."
